The Examination

CompTIA's CDIA certification is an internationally recognized credential acknowledging competency and professionalism in the document imaging CDIA candidates possess critical knowledge of all major areas and technologies used to plan, design and specify an imaging system. To achieve CDIA+ certification, the examinee must take and pass the exam within the specified time (90 minutes). The skills and knowledge measured by this examination are derived from an industry-wide and worldwide job task analysis, which was validated through a survey. The results of the survey are used in weighting the domains and ensuring that the weighting is representative of the relative importance of that content to the job requirements of a document imaging professional with twelve to eighteen months on-the-job experience.

The CDIA exam (in April, 2002) covered the following domains.

- Gather Business Requirements (25%)
- Analyze Business Process (22%)
- Recommend Solution (16%)
- Design Solution (24%)
- Plan for Implementation (13%)

The technologies and areas emphasized in the exam include:

- Input/Capture
- Display
- Storage
- Communications
- Output
- Standard Computing Environment
- Integration
- Management Applications
- Paper handling and pre-processing
